Scott,

On first impression I would strongly advise against it as the ISD would be opening a can of worms and incurring a liability that it currently does not have. The legislation enacting the ISD is quite specific that their responsibility is recreational facilities. Unless it can be clearly shown that this would directly relate to recreational facilities I don't see how we could justify the expense let alone the assumption of liability in maintaining these canals. While the ISD also owns portions of the lakes we do not own the lake bottom as the lakes and connecting water bodies (i.e., canals) fall under the definition a navigable waterways of the State of Florida and are therefore owned by the State of Florida which is why we can't grant permits for residents to build docks on areas of the lakes which the ISD owns.

I would suggest that if there is some interest by the Board in investigating this further then the first thing that should be done is have our district engineer review the storm water permits to determine who is responsible for the upkeep and maintenance of these canals. If the ISD ventures into cleaning one portion of the canal then I am afraid you will have every property owner along the canals telling you to maintain the canals along their property as well. The cost and liability issues could be tremendous, especially if the canal banks are not stable and result in erosion to adjoining properties.

We addressed a similar issue sometime back when residents who owned lakefront property that adjoined portions of the lakes that the ISD owned wanted to hold the ISD liable for cleaning their shorelines of undesirable vegetation and maintaining the stability of the shoreline. The Board determined that this was beyond their authority under the enactment statute as it did not directly relate to maintaining recreational facilities, even though the ISD did determine that limited spraying did maintain the lakes as recreational facilities for use by residents for boating, skiing and fishing.

If it is the pleasure of the Board that the canals be maintained as navigable waterway trails for kayaks and canoes then there might be an argument that this would be for recreational purposes. However, there are quite a few residents who would attempt to use these canals to move their motorized boats from one lake to the other if the canals were ever deepened and maintained which would substantial increase erosion problems along these canals from wakes and props caused by motorized vessels. Once again, I would first have our district engineer check the permits if there is sentiment on the Board to even pursue this matter any further.
